The last two chapters of Revelation give a description of heaven. O what a beautiful picture it is. These chapters refer not to a new social order in this present world, but to the eternal home of the redeemed, the Father's house of many mansions.

These are the most beautiful, comforting, and precious chapters in the whole Bible, one that we never tire of reading -- The New Heaven and New Earth. The first heaven and earth had passed away, as

Peter had said in 2 Peter 3:10, "the heavens shall pass away with a great noise ..." and the earth and its works burned up. What amount of change in the physical universe is involved we do not know.

The Bible begins with a garden and ends with a city. It is THE city, the foundation of which Abraham left his home in Ur of Chaldees to find. The church, the bride of Christ, had made herself an adulteress with the kingdom of the world, and then her name became Babylon. But now the adulteress has disappeared, and the true wife takes her proper place. The tabernacle of God is with men, God's dwelling place, the Father's house of many mansions.

In Eden man was driven from the actual, immediate, conscious presence of God. Here it is restored. In this world we walk by faith. Up there we will actually see His face and be with Him throughout the ceaseless, endless ages. No more death, no tears, no pain, no heartaches or sorrow. A new universe comes into being. How wonderful to be there, especially for those who have known little else but suffering here. The greater the suffering here, the greater the glory up there.

The twelve thousand furlongs pertaining to the measuring of the temple was the symbol of God's people, representing the completed, perfected and glorious state of redeemed creation. The name of the twelve tribes being inscribed on the gates, and the twelve apostles on the

foundation may be meant to indicate that the foundation of the city would never be forgotten, but throughout the endless ages of eternity, would be held in loving remembrance by the city's inhabitants.

As John sees it, the city itself was of pure gold; the walls of diamond; the foundation sparkling with the colors of the rainbow; each gate a pearl. The whole composed of the most valuable and beautiful material things known to man, constructed in a city beyond imagination, beauty, glory, peace and eternal security. O how we would like to go there.

Now we go to the final words, the last chapter in the Bible -- The Tree of Life. The garden of Eden is restored in the midst of the city of gold, paradise and immortality. What will we do in heaven? Probably sing praises to God. Would it be heaven without music?

There will no doubt be every opportunity to develop our unsatisfied aspirations of earth -- life growing, advancing, ever onward, ever upward, taking our place in administration of the universe, incorruptible bodies, in incorruptive surroundings. As the Book begins by pronouncing blessings on those who read and keep its words, so it closes in this last chapter by saying, "Seal not the sayings ... of this book," which is a grave warning not to neglect it, but to study it.

He gives here the final invitation. Jesus said, "I come quickly: ...the Spirit and the bride say, Come." It is

His last recorded word, the parting message to His waiting bride as He passes out of sight. The passage contains an invitation to sinners to come to Him, that they may be ready when He comes.

And now another final warning against the mutilation of God's word. And this final warning condemns men for taking the liberty to eliminate whatever portion of the scriptures they do not like. It does refer particularly to Revelation, but it is also a terrific warning against treating lightly any of God's word.

Now I want to close with this. The Bible is all one story. The last part in the last book in the Bible reads like the close of the story begun in the first part of the first book.

The first words in Genesis: IN THE BEGINNING GOD CREATED THE HEAVENS AND THE EARTH.

Almost the last words in Revelation: I SAW A NEW HEAVEN AND A NEW EARTH.

Genesis: THE GATHERING OF THE WATERS HE CALLED THE SEA.

Revelation: AND THE SEA IS NO MORE.

Genesis: THE DARKNESS HE CALLED NIGHT.
Revelation: THERE SHALL BE NO NIGHT
THERE.

Genesis: GOD MADE THE TWO GREAT LIGHTS, SUN AND MOON.

Revelation: THE CITY HAS NO NEED OF SUN OR MOON, FOR THE GLORY OF GOD DID LIGHTEN IT.

Genesis: IN THE DAY YOU EAT THEREOF YOU SHALL SURELY DIE.

Revelation: DEATH SHALL BE NO MORE.

Genesis: I WILL MULTIPLY YOUR PAIN.

Revelation: NEITHER SHALL THERE BE PAIN ANYMORE.

Genesis: CURSED IS THE GROUND FOR YOUR SAKE.

Revelation: THERE SHALL BE NO MORE CURSE.

Genesis: SATAN APPEARS AS THE DECEIVER OF MANKIND.

Revelation: SATAN DISAPPEARS FOREVER.

Genesis: THEY WERE DRIVEN FROM THE TREE OF LIFE.

Revelation: THE TREE OF LIFE REAPPEARS.

Genesis: MAN WAS DRIVEN FROM GOD'S FACE. Revelation: THEY SHALL SEE HIS FACE.

Genesis: MAN'S PRIMEVAL HOME WAS IN A GARDEN BY A RIVER.
